The welcome address by Dr. Nooruzia Qazi highlighted the dedication and contribution of Bharat Ratna Maharshi Dhondo Keshav Karve towards women empowerment through education. His vision to build a citadel of learning for women encapsulated in the motto of the University “Sanskrita Stree Parashakti” which means ‘An enlightened women is a source of infinite strength’ was presented in the University song, sung by the students of B.A and B.Com. This was followed by the lighting of lamp and garlanding the photo of Maharshi Karve by Chief Guest, Dr. A.L.Sharada, Director, Population First, Shri Sushil Vyas, President of Marwadi Sammelan, Shri Suresh Deora, Secretary of Marwadi Sammelan, Shri Shrikant Dalmia, Trustee of MarwadiSammelan and Principal, Dr. NiniGulla.

A brief presentation about the History of S.N.D.T. Women’s University during the past 100 years was shown, which highlighted the achievements of the University in each decade. The faculty and students paid homage to MaharshiKarve by their brief talk. Monica Tamang and PritiPandey from S.Y.B.A. spoke about his life history and contribution to empowerment of women. Ms. Swati Vaidya, faculty from Department of Economics, spoke about MaharshiKarve’s immediate family to mark the distinctiveness of the visionary’s attitude.

In the Presidential address, Principal, Dr. Nini Gulla paid her tribute to MaharshiKarve, Sir VitthaldasThakersey, Lady PremlilaThackersey and all the people who contributed significantly to the cause for women’s education. She also congratulated the University for providing abundant opportunities to women for higher education thus promoting all round development of the students. She spoke about the glorious past and the dignitaries and leaders who visited the University over the decades. She also mentioned that it was a matter of great pride to be part of

this prestigious University and stated that in harmony with the University's vision our college too is committed and strives to accomplish its mission 'Empowerment of women through academic excellence'.

The Chief Guest, Dr. A.L. Sharada, Director, Population First, in her address on "Women empowerment through Higher Education", commended the commitment of S.N.D.T. Women's University towards building an Inclusive Society where emphasis was laid on empowerment of women and gender equality. She drew the attention of the audience to see the progress made in India over the years towards women empowerment, yet at the same time revealed how the gender development index pertaining to women is still below satisfactory standards. She remarked on the fact that the percentage of working women in primary and secondary schools were still on the rise as compared to them being employed in Higher Education. She reasoned this imbalance to inefficient and unsatisfactory working conditions, lack of adequate crèche facilities for women at work place due to which women after 40 years of age find it a challenge to enjoy work-life balance. She concluded her address emphasizing the need to increase, improve and develop skill and talent among women through women empowerment and higher education for a society free from gender discrimination.

Shri.SushilVyas, President of Marwadi Sammelan, in his address, enlightened the audience about the notable achievements of Maharshi Karve and the hardships faced by him for promoting women's education. He said that Maharshi Karve had started shelter and school for women and widows in 1896, in Hingane outside the city of Pune and would walk several miles from Hingane to Pune to teach at Fergusson College. He stressed on the dedication and contribution of Marwadi Sammelan and reverently remembered his ancestors for realizing the importance of women's education decades ago and valued their support for promoting education for girls. With his inspiring words he motivated the students to admire successful women achievers like Indira Gandhi, PratibhaPatil, KalpanaChawla as role models. Speaking on women empowerment, he said that today women have achieved success in most of the fields and have excelled enormously. He congratulated the University on the Centennial Foundation Day. It was followed by Vote of thanks by Dr. Anita Jacob.

A "Tree Plantation Programme" was organized to mark the Centennial Foundation Day. The Chief Guest, Dr. A.L.Sharada, ShriSushilVyas, President of MarwadiSammelan, Shri Suresh Deora, Secretary of MarwadiSammelan, ShriShrikantDalmia, Trustee of MarwadiSammelan and Convenor of Jr. College, Principal, Dr. NiniGulla, staff and students of the college planted saplings in the college campus to commemorate the momentous occasion. Dr. HemlataMasiwal and Dr.NooruziaQazi along with the students of SYBA and SYBCom created awareness on

environmental sustainability and importance of promoting green growth. A Quiz Competition was conducted to create awareness among the students about the glorious history of S.N.D.T. Women's University.

15 July - Gender Equality and Women Empowerment - Population First

A talk on Gender Equality and Women Empowerment was organized for the student in association with Population First. Three women from *Anganwadi* shared their experiences with the students and inspired the students to stand for their rights and never to give up.

AUGUST 2015

20 August 2015 – Young Women's Leadership Programme by Blue Ribbon Movement

An Orientation programme for Young Women's Leadership Programme by Ms. Kejal Salve from Blue Ribbon Movement was conducted on 20th August, 2015. She told the students about leadership qualities, team work, empathy and importance of community service to develop their leadership skills, communication skills and overall personality. She assigned some tasks to the students to test their leadership capabilities. The students were given half an hour to complete the tasks assigned to them which included –

- i. To do one random act of kindness
- ii. Written complaint to BMC pertaining to any current issue.

On the basis of their performance the leaders were selected for the Leadership Programme.

21 August 2015 – NSS Orientation Programme

N.S.S Orientation programme was conducted for about 200 volunteers of the college. The orientation lecture was delivered by Mrs. Chitra Lele, Dept. of Political Science of S.N.D.T Women's University. She highlighted the importance and need for NSS and explained the various activities in which the students can participate and contribute for the betterment of the community. She also informed about the NSS motto, symbol, and its significance. The learning experience can help to accelerates the advancement of women in management and leadership positions.
2. to empower women entrepreneurial leaders to reach their full potential to create economic and social value for themselves, their organizations, and society
3. to develop the spiritual awakening of women in modern times, ethical leadership and social responsibility.

The speakers were from diverse areas and included corporate leaders, Head of NGO, Author, Strategist & Consultant, Head of Institutes/Universities, Entrepreneurs/Industrialists, Spiritual Monk. The students gained useful knowledge on Leadership.

24th and 25th August 2015 - Employability Skill Development Training Programme

Workshop on Employability Skills was conducted in association with Lodha Foundation. The workshop was conducted by Mrs. Suman Keluskar. Employability skills are the foundation of students’ career yet it is found lacking in students so is was extremely important to impart these skills to our students. Students were given training in soft skills, interview tips, team work, business and customer awareness, problem solving and creativity, communication skills, positive attitudes, IT skills and entrepreneurship.

SEPTEMBER 2015

1st September –Disaster Management Workshop

Disaster Management Workshop was organized for the students and community in the college premises on 1st September, 2015. Mr. Rajendra Lokhande, Disaster Management Cell, BMC, spoke about the major disasters, natural calamities and accidents that occur. He emphasized on the importance of effective Disaster Management system. He also explained the extent of

damage caused in terms of human and material loss when disasters happen. Group discussion on Swachha Bharat Abhiyan - 30th September, 2015

8th December, 2015 – Awareness Lecture on Women Commuter Safety Seminar – by Railway Protection Force Western Railway

An awareness lecture on Women Commuter Safety Awareness by Railway Protection Force was conducted on 8th December, 2015. Western Railways Senior Commissioner Shri Anand Vijay Jha along with other Senior and Junior Inspectors, Head Constables and other Constables conducted the session. They focused on the safety aspect of commuters travelling by railways. They emphasized on the concept of unity is strength and the importance of Women's Safety. The

The Senior Inspectors and Lady Constables shared their experiences and told about the use of technology and CCTV camera at railway stations and measures adopted for the safety and security of the commuters.

The aim was to create trained young volunteers from National Service Scheme (NSS) to collaborate and join hands with civil administration to provide quick rescue and relief services in the event of sudden natural calamities and disasters. The volunteers were also trained in youth and mob control, carrying victims to ambulances, life-saving and administration of relief camps.

They also assisted the senior citizens and guided the women and children for conducting the eye check up. They helped in distribution of free spectacles, medicines and conducted awareness programme. Over 1000 people visited the camp which was conducted from 8.30 a.m. to 2.30 p.m. The NSS volunteers interacted with the community and had a good learning experience. The volunteers were given ‘Certificate of Appreciation’ from KARM NGO.

12 January, 2016- National Youth Day by Ramkrishna Mission

The National Youth Day was conducted by Ramkrishna Mission on 12th January, 2016 to celebrate the 153rd birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda. The Theme was “Indian Youth for Development, Skill and Harmony”. The NSS volunteers attended the Seminar at Swami Vivekananda Auditorium, Khar.

The students were shown short films on gender equality, eve teasing, domestic violence, followed by group discussions and interaction by Mrs. Neeta Khajuria. She explained the challenges an adolescent faces while growing up and ways to cope with the changes. She explained how relationships play an important role in teenage and how to keep oneself emotionally balanced in any relationship. She spoke about the social aspect of “Gender and Equality”. She encouraged the students to be change makers in the society and have the courage to voice their opinions and fight against injustice.

11th February 2016 – Visit to Kalaghoda Festival

150 NSS volunteers were taken to Kalaghoda festival near Rhythm House. The Kala Ghoda Arts Festival is a community celebration of the arts within one of the most beautiful and historic precincts of Mumbai. Nehru Science Centre has more than 500 hands-on and interactive science exhibits on energy, sound, kinematics, mechanics, transport, etc. installed in the science park & different galleries. The NSC building with its unique architecture houses several permanent science expositions on various themes.

29 February, 2016 - Swami Vivekanand Exam

200 NSS students were given an orientation about Swami Vivekananda. 40 Volunteers gave Swami Vivekanand Exam. The objective was to make the students aware of Swami Vivekananda's fundamental educational ideas of imparting life-building, man-making and character-building education by combining the best elements of the East and the West. He envisioned an educational system wherein the rich cultural and spiritual heritage of our country with its hoary tradition of values like sacredness of knowledge, shraddha, devotion to truth, etc., blended with modern science.

All the 150 volunteers were divided into groups to conduct the Socio-Economic Survey of 100 houses in the slums in Shimla Nagar, adopted area. The students were first oriented about filling

the survey questionnaire and then sent to conduct the survey. 100 houses were covered on the 1st and 2nd day of the camp.

In the post-lunch session of 1st and 2nd December, the volunteers cleared the debris of Shantivan garden and prepared compost pits by bricks. They swept the garden and surrounding areas and created awareness in the community about Cleanliness and *Swaccha Bharat Abhiyan*. The overall aim of the activities was to revive the abandoned and neglected BMC garden Shantivan and restore its beauty. The activity was conducted in association with NGO Shanti Foundation. The cleanliness drive and beautification of BMC Garden Shantivan Garden for the community was carried on for 4 days of the camp and the outcome of the hard work put in by the volunteers was appreciated by all in the area.

3rd December, 2015 - Workshop on Employability Skills

The students and the community members were taught to prepare Handicraft Items. The resource persons Ms. Bina Thakkar and Mrs. Kshama Tamankar conducted the workshop. The NSS Unit provided old newspapers, calendars, recycled articles and other raw materials required to make Torans, Lanterns, Paper Bags and other Handicraft items.

In the afternoon session the students carried out Cleanliness Awareness programme by cleaning street and the adjacent abandoned garden. They prepared posters on cleanliness and displayed them in the area to spread the message of cleanliness in the community.

Awareness Lecture on 'Harmful effects of Mobile Radiation' was conducted by Mr. Prakash Munshi. He spoke about the mobile tower and the impact of mobile radiation on health. He demonstrated by covering the mobile phones with aluminium foil and advised the students to hold the mobiles away while speaking on the phone and to keep mobiles at a safe distance while sleeping.

4th December, 2015 - Yoga Workshop and Awareness on Sujok Therapy-

The students cleared the boundary fencing area of all weeds, stones and creepers for painting the boundary walls of the garden. The entire garden was cleaned and saplings were planted in the BMC garden, Shantivan.

In the afternoon session, Yoga Workshop was conducted for the students by a representative from Ramkrishna Mission, Ms. Sujata. She taught the students yoga *asanas* necessary for

maintaining good physical and mental health and informed about the benefits of each asanas to remain healthy and to overcome stress. Yoga, meditation, stretching and strengthening muscles, deep breathing exercises, relaxation techniques were also taught to the students and were regularly practiced during the camp.

Sujok Therapy Workshop was conducted by International Lions Club in the post lunch session. The Zonal Coordinator Mrs.Chitra Lele visited the Special Camp adopted area, Shantivan Garden. She appreciated the good work being done by the students and motivated them to continue community service.

5th December, 2015 – Women Empowerment - Trade Fair *Unnati*

Trade Fair Unnati was organized during the Special Camp for Women Empowerment. The Trade Fair helped to develop leadership skills, team work, communication skills and gain practical knowledge about selling, marketing, pricing, designing and other skills required to be independent and successful entrepreneurs. The Students actively participated in the Trade Fair, 'Unnati'. Shri Suresh Deora, Secretary of Marwadi Sammelan and Principal Dr. Nini Gulla inaugurated the Trade Fair. The students displayed handicraft articles, mehendi, cosmetic articles, food stalls and games. The Chief Guest and Principal encouraged and appreciated the efforts of the students. The community interaction also helped the students to understand their potential and improve their skills.

6th and 7th December, 2015- CLEANLINESS DRIVE, COMMUNITY WORK and ENVIRONMENT AWARENESS at SANJAY GANDHI NATIONAL PARK, BORIVALI.

150 NSS volunteers assembled at the National Park to carry out the Community work. The forest officer in-charge accompanied the volunteers to the area to conduct the community work. The volunteers were divided into 2 groups. The first group of volunteers carried out the Cleanliness Drive Programme. They collected plastic bags, wrappers and other waste articles and filled 80 bags of garbage and made the area plastic free. The volunteers created awareness among the community to make the surrounding a 'No-Plastic Zone' and told the park visitors to use trash bins and not to litter.

The other group of volunteers actively participated in collecting and depositing the soil and manure in the nursery area. They dug out the mud, removed plastic bags and other waste from it and transferred the mud inside the nursery area. The students worked together by making a

human chain to pass the mud inside the nursery. They learnt the importance of team work. The volunteers cleaned the nursery and surrounding areas. They swept the place and transferred saplings in the nursery area.

Group Discussion on Social Issues, Environment and Community awareness was conducted. Street Play was enacted by the volunteers on issues concerning dowry, gender discrimination and education.

An Environmental Awareness Programme was conducted for the NSS volunteers. They were taken on a guided nature trail and told about the fauna and flora found in the National Park.

The students distributed books, stationery, old clothes, toys, etc. in the tribal area in National Park.

Valedictory

A valedictory programme was organized on the last day of the camp. The students made a power presentation of the activities conducted during the camps and shared their experiences with the Principal, faculty members and other NSS students. They made collage of pictures of the Camp and displayed on the College notice board and were appreciated for their environment awareness and valuable contribution to the society.
