INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC) REPORT Academic Year 2019-20

Workshop on 'Filling and Submission of AQAR under new NAAC Methodology' was conducted on 1st July, 2019. Dr. Anita Jacob briefed the teachers about filling AQAR as per the revised framework. She gave an overview of the Workshop attended on the changed Methodology adopted by NAAC to submit AQAR online. 15 teachers participated in the workshop.

Faculty Development Programme - Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) conducted a Faculty Development Programme on "New Teaching Pedagogy in Higher Education Institutions" from 4th July - 24th July 2019 for the Staff members. 19 Teachers from Degree and Junior College attended the FDP. Ms. Swati Vaidya, Dr. Nooruzia Qazi and Ms. Kavita Patil conducted hands on training sessions on Creating Moodle Account and Course Content; Creating Webpage and Uploading Educational Resources using Google Sites; OERs, Freeware and Paid sources; Creating and Managing Blogs; Using Apps for Online Teaching, Learning and Evaluation; Animations; Speech to Text, Audio tools, voice modulation; Security Issues; Creating Google Forms; Online Assessment Tools; and many other resources.

Workshop on 'E-Filing of Income-Tax Returns' for Parents and Staff was organised on 16th August, 2019. Dr. Ganatra Kashyap demonstrated the steps for filing Income-Tax Returns Online. CAS Promotion – Screening Committee procedure and follow up for Promotion of Ten Teachers under Career Advancement Scheme, Stage I to II and Stage II to III. The Screening Committee Meeting was conducted on 30th January, 2020 and on 4th February, 2020.

"COVID-19: GUIDANCE AND COUNSELING CELL"

As per the directives received from S.N.D.T. Women's University, the College constituted the "COVID-19: GUIDANCE AND COUNSELING CELL", for students and all its stakeholders,

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to facilitate guidance and counseling relating to examinations, academic matters, mental health, counselling and other issues, arising during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Cell ensures dissemination of authentic information about Circulars received from S.N.D.T. Women's University, Mumbai, regarding examination, academic and other matters and regularly updates students and all its stakeholders via. Email, College Website, WhatsApp, Telegram, and other digital media platforms. The college Counselling Cell "甘河미", also provided continuous counselling through online mode during the pandemic, for ensuring the Mental Health and Well-being of students, staff, alumni and their family members.

Various Initiatives were taken by all the Departments and Committees for Mental Health and Well-Being of Students during COVID-19 outbreak. 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Two Days National Seminar on "नई शिक्षा नीति और भारतीय भाषाएँ"

23rd and 24th March, 2023

The Department of Hindi of Marwadi Sammelan's B. M. Ruia Girls' College affiliated to the S.N.D.T Women's University, Mumbai in collaboration with Maharashtra State Hindi Sahitya Academy organised a Two Days National Seminar on "नई शिक्षा नीति और भारतीय भाषाएँ" (New Education Policy and Indian Languages) on 23rd and 24th March, 2023 in hybrid mode in the college auditorium as well as on Google Meet platform and YouTube. The seminar commenced with Maharashtra Geet followed by college prayer, recorded in the voice of Smt. Shruti Ranade, Associate Professor of Psychology and a Counsellor at the College Counseling Cell 'Mantrana' followed by the S.N.D.T Women's University song.

Inaugural Session

The seminar was inaugurated on 23rd March, 2023 at 2.30 pm with the Keynote address by Prof. T. V. Kattimani, Hon. Vice Chancellor of Central Tribal University of Andhra Pradesh. The inaugural session was presided over by Adv. Shri. Sushil Vyas, President, Marwadi Sammelan. The Chief Guest of the session was Prof. Ujwala Chakradeo, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of S.N.D.T Women's University, Mumbai. Shri. Shrikant Dalmia, Convenor of B. M. Ruia Girls' College was the Guest of Honour. Shri. Suresh Deora, Hon. Secretary, Marwadi Sammelan and Shri. Shailesh Dalmia, a member of Marwadi Sammelan were also present. The Principal and the Head of the Department of Hindi, Dr. Santosh Kaul Kak welcomed the dignitaries on the dais and highlighted various programmes organised by the college, especially A Series of 13 Webinars on various aspects of National Education Policy 2020 organised on online mode during the Covid-19 Pandemic. In her introductory remarks she specified the three-language formula recommended by NEP 2020 and the role of translation in the implementation of NEP 2020.

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Prof. T. V. Kattimani in his keynote address deliberated upon colloquial languages, Tribal languages, and also the oral tradition of some tribes of India. In his view, the condition of the Hindi language is improving because the number of speakers is higher in comparison with other Indian languages. NEP 2020 has introduced the education through mother tongue which will need good translators to translate the reference books into the Indian languages. He advised teachers to come out of their comfort zones and adopt a blend of technology with traditional methods. At the end of his speech, he asked a question to the faculties "Are the faculties ready to adapt to futuristic technology?"

Prof. Ujwala Chakradeo, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Madam in her address, congratulated the principal for organising the seminar. She stressed on the importance of languages, and said that at the primary level, the education will be in mother tongues, but in the case of higher education, the study and use of mother tongues along with English and other foreign languages is a must. She ended her address by highlighting the S.N.D.T Women's University's initiative of teaching some courses in 4 languages.

The president of Marwadi Sammelan, Adv. Shri. Sushil Vyas in his speech commended the innovative initiatives taken by the college. He foregrounded the commitment of Marwadi Sammelan towards society and women's education and assured the principal and faculties that the management is ready to contribute to the implementation of the NEP 2020.

First Session

The first session of the seminar was held on 23rd March 2023 from 4.30 pm onwards. It was titled as "नई शिक्षा नीति और संस्कृत, मराठी, कोंकणी भाषा". This session was presided over by Dr. Sudhakar Mishra, a renowned Critic and Poet, Mumbai. The Chief Guest of this session was Prof. Manpreet Kaur, Head, Department of Hindi, Gurunanak College of Arts, Commerce and Science, Mumbai. The subject experts were Dr. Ganpati V. Hegde (Sanskrit Language), Principal, Mumbadevi Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya, Bhartiya Vidya Bhavan, Mumbai, Dr.

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Amol Shivaji Chavan (Marathi Language), Abhinav Education Society's College of Education, Ambegaon, Pune, and Dr. Gunaji Sadanand Desai (Konkani Language), Department of Konkani, Parvatibai Chaughule Mahavidyalaya, Goa.

This session began with a research paper presentation by Dr. Geeta Yadav from S.M.R.K College, Nashik on "Nai Shiksha Niti aur Hindi'. Her paper was informative that discussed the various aspects of higher education including the recommendations made by the Kasturi Ranjan Committee. She mentioned the opportunities through the Hindi language and explained the limitations that Hindi cannot be made as a national language as India is a multilingual country. The paper presentation was followed by the talks by the experts.

Dr. Ganpati V. Hegde discussed the challenges and possibilities in the Sanskrit language. He emphasised translating the knowledge available in Sanskrit texts into Indian languages rather than translating it from English. He pointed out that Sanskrit is not only the language of religion but also of knowledge. He explained the 4.16 from the NEP 2020 draft and commented on the possible job opportunities for the Sanskrit language graduates.

Dr. Amol Shivaji Chavan on a very positive note started his presentation and said that we need to forget about what happened earlier. We should look forward to the present and future of Indian languages. He, while deliberating upon the challenges which the Marathi language is facing, expressed his worry about the flexibility and inclusivity of the syllabus and its interdisciplinary nature. While discussing the plan of action for drafting the syllabus of Marathi he explained that level 1 would have regular prescribed syllabus, level 2 will have a syllabus according to the Academic Bank of Credits and level 3 will have a syllabus of certificate courses. Creating a Marathi Learning Management System according to him is important. These changes will open new possibilities for the global syllabus of Marathi which ultimately result in the further progress of the Marathi language.

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Dr. Gunaji Desai said that Konkani scholars are working on a smaller scale. Choices are fewer but they are getting exposure now. They are publishing books in the Konkani language and their books are receiving awards from Sahitya Academy and other institutes. He said his college is autonomous and they change their syllabus after every two years. In his view, while implementing NEP 2020 workload needs to be defined clearly to avoid confusion. We need to see that a student who has scored 85% should be encouraged to learn Indian Languages. He also shared his own experience in Japan where he presented in English language and students received its translation immediately in Japanese and argued that we also need to develop such a system.

Prof. Manpreet Kaur while addressing the participants said that changing mindset is important in case of anticipation of opposition to the Hindi language. Translation from regional and Sanskrit languages should be done rather than from English. Methods of teaching in National Education Policy 2020 are only on paper, they rather need to be implemented. NEP 2020 talks about the preference for mother tongue but we give unnecessary importance to the English language. If you go to Germany there is a rule that you must learn their language. She quoted a saying in English- "If you don't respect your own language, then you will not be respected by anybody." She ended her address on the note that until we do something for our language the efforts of the Government will not be of any use.

Second Session

The second session of the seminar was held on 24th March, 2023 from 9.30 am onwards. It was titled as "नई शिक्षा नीति और बांग्ला, काश्मिरी, पंजाबी भाषा". This session was presided over by Prof. Sanjeev Kumar Dubey, Dean of Arts Faculty and Controller of Examination, Central University of Gujrat, Gandhinagar. The Chief Guest of this session was Prof. Dattatraya Murumkar, Head, Department of Hindi, University of Mumbai, Mumbai. The subject expert was Prof. Priyakant Nath (Bangla Language), Head, Bangla Language and Centre for Studies in Endangered Languages, Assam University, Silchar.

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This session started with a research paper presentation by Smt. Sunita Chauhan, Wilson College, Mumbai. She discussed the challenges of the digitalisation of study material, the vacant teaching full-time posts, and contractual posts proposed by the government. Indian institutes do not have a ranking in top institute ranking among the world's top institutes. Implementation of this Policy will actually decide how effective it is.

Prof. Priyakant Nath discussed NEP 2020 in the light of national integration, equal opportunities, exposure to inner talent, and language heritage. To maintain our heritage we should preserve and encourage education through regional languages. Assam University has implemented NEP 2020 in 2022-23. Skill Development courses have been introduced but students are facing problems regarding language and technology. Community Engagement in literature subject has been introduced. Students are collecting data and working energetically. They visit different villages and collect data about the reach of government schemes. However, the university is bearing the cost of these visits. He added that they do not know whether they will receive funds for community work and the results of NEP 2020 will be in our hands after 4-5 years. He requested the government to address the issues of registration in case of entry and exit of various students. There might be an issue of space if we allow the end number of admissions in one course. For example, how to address the issue of arranging space for 300 students in a course.

Dattatraya Murumkar in his address pointed out the importance of the Tribhasha Sutra, what is new in the New Education Policy, and Macaulay's first education policy. He shared his personal experience regarding a good number of admissions in English Medium Schools. In this scenario introducing education through mother tongues is little challenging. In cities, CBSE and ICSE Boards teach other foreign languages. According to him, it is not invalid to teach foreign languages as learning various languages helps to develop one's personality but forgetting or ignoring Indian languages is what needs to be deliberated upon.

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Prof. Sanjeev Kumar Dubey asked a question at the outset "How to make many languages the medium of education?" We should follow 22 languages as mediums. One state one language medium policy should be introduced. In his opinion, we need to introduce new words from other regional languages so that there will be words for objects in all the regional languages. The nation is created by emotion. How would Sanskrit compete with Hindi or any other language in the present world? Indian languages are going to face challenges as well as opportunities. It is up to us how we take it ahead. NEP 2020 also discusses Out Come Based Learning which includes Program Outcomes, Course Outcomes, and Unit Outcomes. Only literature cannot be a base of language. Why do we not teach a script of a film in the syllabus? We need to make an innovative syllabus and prepare our students for the fields where there are more job opportunities. Our HRDCs need to invite resource persons who discuss innovative teaching of various languages.

Third Session

The third session of the seminar was held on 24th March, 2023 from 11.00 am onwards. It was titled as "ਜई शिक्षा नीति और मिथे ली, गुजराती, उर्दू भाषा". This session was presided over by Dr. Sanjeev Nigam, Director, Hindustani Prachar Sabha, Mumbai. The Chief Guest of this session was Prof. Hubnath Pandey, Professor, Department of Hindi, University of Mumbai, Mumbai. The subject experts were Prof. Vandana Zha (Maithili Language), Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Varanasi, Dr. Darshana Ozha, Professor, Gujarati Language, S.N.D.T. Women's University, Mumbai, and Hazrat Ansari (Urdu Language), Principal, Rais High School and Junior College, Bhiwandi.

Prof. Vandana Zha in her talk mentioned that the language of the nation is its heritage. We should learn our languages to recognise the multilingualism of our country. In the case of the Maithili language, around 1.5 crore people speak Maithili. In 2003 Maithili was accepted as a language recognised by the constitution. If we study in our mother tongue then we do not need a translation. Scientific approaches can be developed through the mother tongue. One of the

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problems is how we create study material in Indian languages. The translation is going to play an important role in the implementation of NEP 2020. 15 rivers flow through Mithila, therefore, Nadisahitya needs to be studied through the perspective of ecofeminism.

Dr. Darshana Ozha in her address in Gujarati language deliberated upon the chapter on education through Indian languages in NEP 2020 and the holistic development of the students. Holistic development, according to her, includes students' spiritual development as well. Value-based and Skill-based education should be taught in the mother tongue of the students so that they can bring innovations in their fields. A multilingual approach is the need of the hour. Our university, S.N.D.T Women's University, runs a few courses in 4 languages which include Marathi, English, Hindi, and Gujarati. Certain things are learnt only through mother tongue Under a pool of value-added courses, CHETNA being introduced and implemented by S.N.D.T Women's University will help students to learn various employability skills and gain credits.

Hazrat Ansari in his talk stated that Hindi, Marathi, Bengali, and Gujarati are related to each other in some or the other way like Urdu is related to other Indian languages. He quoted an Urdu poem "Mai chup raha to galatfaimiya badhi, vo bhi suna unhone jo maine kaha nahi" and highlighted the issue of dying languages. Only 7% of people in India speak Urdu. Moreover, the job opportunities through Urdu are very few. Urdu is facing the same crisis as other Indian languages. Though Urdu is not a regional language it is spoken in all the states of India. Still, the condition of Urdu is not good. Maharashtra is the state where Urdu is taught in higher secondary schools as well but in other states, it is taught only at the primary level.

Prof. Hubnath Pandey in his address cited examples of countries like Russia where medical science books are written in Hindi as well. Science textbooks in India are written in various Indian languages but the scientists do not write their innovations in Hindi. The English language market is huge. He warned the participants that we are all crazy about the English language. Until and unless we overcome our attitude towards the English language we will not be able to implement NEP 2020 effectively. We need good translators if we want our languages

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to be enriched. We also need to remember that we cannot progress without the English language, but we also need to develop our languages with the help of English. If we are talking about 'Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam' we must not emphasise only on our languages. He cited an example of the book Sapiens written by Yuval Noah Harari and its translation into Indian languages. He cautioned everyone that India has a rooted caste and class system in the education system. We need to tackle this issue as well. Multiple exits is a risky option as there is a possibility of students leaving immediately after completing 1 year and might not continue their education afterwards.

Dr. Sanjeev Nigam in the beginning his address quoted the lines of a poem written by Sultan Ahmad "Raste jab naye banaoge kuch to kante jarur paoge, hath andhera jarur kuchlega jab dipak jalaoge". He talked about the computerisation of the Banking Industry in the 1990s. and commended the NEP 2020. He said that it will definitely prove to be fruitful for future generations of students. Only implementation will lead us towards solutions to the problems in NEP 2020. He added that we need to change the mindset of the parents and students and produce knowledge in our Indian languages to develop our languages further.

Fourth Session

The fourth session of the seminar was held on 24th March, 2023 from 2.00 pm onwards. It was titled as "नई शिक्षा नीति और सिधीं, तलेगु, तिमल भाषा". This session was presided over by Prof. Sunita Sakhare, Head, Department of Hindi, S.N.D.T Women's University, Mumbai. The Chief Guest of this session was Dr. M. L. Gupta, Founder and Director, Vaishvik Hindi Sammelan, Mumbai. The subject experts were Dr. Sandhya Kundanani (Sindhi Language), Head, Department of Sindhi, C. H. College, Ulhasnagar, Kalyan, Maharashtra, Prof. C. H. Ramchandra Murty (Telugu Language), Professor of Telugu Language, Banaras Hindu University, Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh and Prof. R. Thamotharan (Tamil Language), Centre of Indian Languages, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi.

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Prof. R. Thamotharan expressed his views on National Education Policy 2020 and Tamil Language. He elucidated upon some aspects of the Tamil language: Literary Tamil which includes Sangam literature and Bhakti literature which is also a social movement. Grammatical Tamil basically refers to Tamil as an ancient language of the world. The grammar of Tamil and Sanskrit is ancient grammar. Two ancient grammar texts are available in the Tamil language. Archaeological Tamil refers to the documents written during the Harappa civilisation. Sanketik Tamil has two stages. Scientific Tamil History is available. Many technological dictionaries are also available in the Tamil language. Since each language has special features, a new approach to education helps to bring these specialities. There are limitations in implementing NEP 2020 as the three-language formula might not work as effectively as expected.

Ms. Uma Prabhu from B. M. Ruia Girls' College, Mumbai presented a research paper on "NEP 2020 and Konkani Language". She shared her personal experience of how she faced difficulties in case of getting a copy of a particular book. She cited a story of a Konkani language play by Suchita Narwekar titled, 'Kahani Navya Yugachi'. This play talks about the Konkani language. If we do not promote our language then the cultural heritage will be lost. She referred to the post-effects of colonisation and suggested unlearning what we have already learnt.

Mr. Rakesh Panse from Mithibai College (Autonomous), Mumbai presented a paper on National Education Policy 2020 and Indian Languages. He, at the outset of his address, criticised 'live-in relationship' and mouned about the lost cultural heritage. According to him, Hindi is the language which passes culture from one to another. Globalisation has also affected regional languages. The Western culture influenced Indian culture and killed our culture.

Dr. Champa Masiwal from the Post-graduate Department of Hindi, M. D. Shah Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Malad, Mumbai presented a research paper on Kumaon and Garhwali languages. She meticulously argued that since these languages are colloquial languages, Hindi writers have used these languages in their Hindi literature. She also mentioned the number of dialects of the above-mentioned languages. According to her, to provide education in our

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colloquial languages we need to create technical words in these languages. The translators need to address the issue of coining new words and preparing various dictionaries.

Prof. C. Ram Chandra mentioned that the Telugu language came into use 1500 years ago. According to him, students should study at least 2-3 languages. We need this base of languages to achieve national integration. NEP 2020 aims to develop patriotism amongst Indian citizens. Indian languages should be prescribed in the syllabus.

Dr. M. L. Gupta in his address said that language works as a political polarization. He asked a question "How many students are taking education in their mother tongues?" The best medium is the medium of mother-tongue. It is also important to avoid politicising languages. NEP 2020 does not mention that students have to study a particular language and should not study other languages. As NEP 2020 gives importance to multilingualism, it is important to note that no language will be imposed on the students.

Dr. Sandhya Kundanani spoke about the compulsion of studying two Indian languages. She also brought some points to the notice of the participants that artists are judged on the grounds of their art and not their languages. If we want to bring a smile to students' faces then we need to encourage multiple entries and exits. It is a good thing that the government is giving importance to Indian languages.

Prof. Sunita Sakhare in her address clarified that the students studying in the first year need to opt for any one language of their choice and they need to study that. It could be any one language. There is no compulsion regarding studying any particular language. She also commented on how the students of S.N.D.T Women's University have benefitted from the courses that the university run in 4 mediums.

Valedictory Session

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The valedictory session of the seminar was held on 24th March, 2023 from 3.30 pm onwards. It was titled as "नई शिक्षा नीति और और भारतीय भाषाएँ". The valedictory session was presided over by Adv. Shri Sushil Vyas, President, Marwadi Sammelan.

Prof. Shyamsunder Pandey from Birla College, Kalyan, a former faculty of B. M. Ruia Girls' College and Dr. Sandesha Bhavsar, Assistant Professor, Department of Hindi, S.N.D.T Women's University, Mumbai expressed their views on the seminar and presented their feedback.


NATIONAL LEVEL QUIZ on 'राष्ट्रीय शिक्षा नीति 2020 - प्रमुख बिन्दु'

Dr. Smriti Bhosle, Director, Centre for Distance Education SNDT Women's University, Mumbai, was the Resource Person for the National Webinar on 'NEP 2020: Awareness For Stakeholders'

She introduced the new education system of India's 'National Education Policy 2020' emphasizing the transformation it will bring in terms of raising the employability of students in Higher Education.

The resource person began her session by sharing her views on the National Education Policy 2020. She stated that the current strategy of the government to revamp the educational policy is aimed at making it more student-centric, accessible, and inclusive.

She explained that the current NEP had replaced the 34-year-old national education policy formulated in 1986. She briefed on the five pillars of NEP: Access, Equity, Quality, Affordability, and Accountability.

She spoke about the objectives of this policy and its main highlights, stating that NEP 2020 will ensure that students acquire diverse expertise, including problem-solving, critical thinking, creativity, and communication, that are vital to succeed in the 21st Century Workforce.

Dr. Smriti Bhosle Madam also explained the credit framework of Higher Education Graduate and Post Graduate Programs. She explained the multiple entry and exit system along with the appropriate certification brought out by NEP 2020. She also explained the Academic Bank of Credits concept and its significance for every student.

She explained in detail the curricular components of the Undergraduate and Postgraduate Programs. She emphasized significant, minor, multidisciplinary, ability enhancement courses, skill enhancement courses, internship/apprenticeship, and Research related projects.

The session ended with an active question-answer session which cleared the doubts of many stakeholders.
